Principal's Report

Enrichment Education

At present we are undertaking an evaluation of our current enrichment education programs across the school. We are using relevant Departmental documents and research to implement clear identification procedures within our school for students who are gifted and talented. To begin this process in 2017 all families with children in Year 2 to Year 5 will receive a letter today outlining some changes to our processes for class placement in 2018.

We will be holding a parent information session on **Thursday 9 November at 6:30pm** in the school hall to provide you with additional information about the changes to enrichment class placement and enrichment education programs K-6.

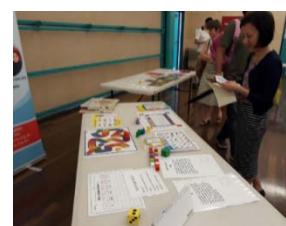
Kindergarten Orientation



Our Kindergarten Orientation visits continue to occur on Thursday mornings from 10am until 11am. These have been a huge success. Parents have been involved in information sessions to better equip them with tools to support their children's learning, whilst the students have been participating in a variety of activities, including craft, singing and developmental play.

Last week we provided a more interactive session for parents. We set up a variety of literacy and numeracy activities that the teachers use to support learning in Kindergarten classrooms. This gave parents an insight into the ways in which student learning can be done through games and interaction.

Anti Bullying

Over the next two weeks the students of Denistone East will continue with their learning about Bullying.

This fortnight's lessons are

L- Learning how to respond to bullying and L - Let's help each other

The lessons will focus on how students can respond to bullying, and how they can help people who are being bullied.

Road Safety

This term all students at Denistone East will be learning about Road Safety. Last Wednesday Stage 2 devoted the day to practical and interactive experiences, exploring three different areas –

Pedestrian: We took a walk around our school area and discussed how to keep safe and the rules associated with crossing at lights, crossing at roundabouts, zebra crossings as well as areas that are unsafe such as teacher's car parks and driveways.

Passenger: We discussed the different capsules and booster seats suitable for children and the recommended age for each.

Wheels: We discussed the need to wear helmets whenever riding a bicycle, scooter, skateboard etc. and the different perspectives that the driver will have of our actions.

Stage 3 Safety Day



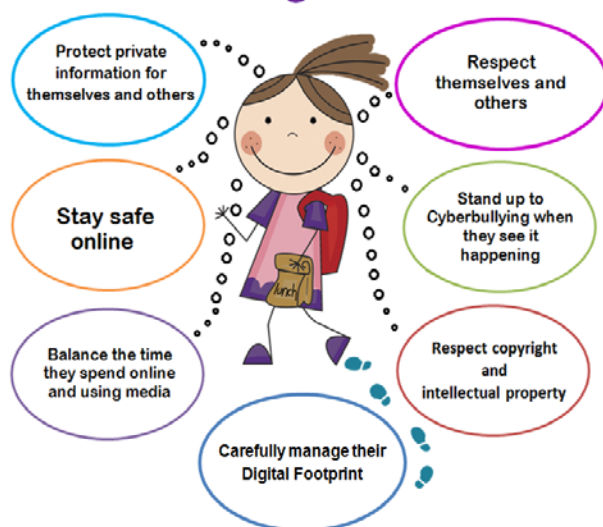

Pool & Grounds Update

Royal Life NSW provided an update on our pool at the P&C meeting last Wednesday evening. Royal Life will submit the finalised plans to the NSW Department of Education and Ryde Council in the next 3-4 weeks. Currently they are planning to build a 25m pool (subject to approval) facility which includes on deck showers, changing facilities, viewing area, meeting rooms and office space. This is a very sympathetic construction as the proposed building mirrors the tones and colours of our existing buildings, which means it will blend right in. Royal Life hope to start construction in early 2018, with hopes to have the pool operational within Term 1 of 2019.

Our relieving principal Ms Verinder shared the latest preliminary plans for the fantastic interactive learning and recreation area for our children that will include an artificial soccer pitch (which can be broken into two) replacement of existing synthetic play surface and the re-landscaping and planning of the play areas. These plans look fantastic and it is hoped that these works will be completed in early Term 1 2018.

At Wednesday evening's meeting, the P&C approved \$80,000.00 (which includes the Moonlight Markets fundraising) contribution to the project, taking total amount submitted by the P&C towards this project to \$110,000.00. Based on the feedback from the parent survey earlier in the year, the improvement of the grounds was a significant issue so the P&C have allocated funds accordingly.

The Cottage (2nd hand uniform shop)

The Cottage will be open on Wednesday 8 November 9:20am-10:00am and every fortnight after that (i.e. on every odd week of term 4). We would like to thank all the parents who have donated their kids' uniforms to the shop and we are always grateful for any donations of used uniforms in relatively good condition (please, no large tears/holes!)

** If you wish to donate used uniforms on the days we are not opened, please leave them with the school office for us to pick up on another day*

Moonlight Markets

The school is planning a major upgrade of the grounds bordering Henderson Rd which will include new artificial turf, mini soccer pitch, new plantings and beautification of the area. This work is expected to cost approximately \$250-300K with work planned to commence in Term 4 this year. All funds raised from the markets will be used to support the grounds upgrade.

Returning this year will be the 9D-Cinema, Side Show alley with games for the kids, our ever-popular community food stalls plus performances from the school bands/ensembles and aerobics teams.

We hope to see all our families at this event, spread the word to your families, neighbours and friends.

Just a small reminder the P&C and community food stalls only accept cash, so we welcome any gold coins and small note denominations that you are able to bring along
