Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is spending \$6 billion over four years to deliver more than 170 new and upgraded schools. This includes an additional \$160 million in 2018/19 as part of the record \$747 million maintenance investment announced last year. This is the biggest investment in public school infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Denistone East Public School

A project is underway to upgrade Denistone East Public School. The project will include the provision of a new building featuring flexible learning spaces and special programs rooms, and a refurbishment of the existing administration building.

Progress summary

Early works have begun on site including the installation of fencing, commencement of excavation along with works on the administration building. Trucks will now be entering and exiting the site on a regular basis.

Work hours are as follows:

- 7am 5pm weekdays
- 7am 1pm Saturdays

We are here to make sure that work is completed safely and efficiently and we will minimise impacts on the community at every opportunity.

Major works will commence in November, following approval of the development application.

The forecast project completion is in early 2020.

Ethics classes at Denistone East Public School

Dear Parents and Carers,

Could you be an ethics teacher for Denistone East Public School?

Some of our current ethics teachers who are parent volunteers are moving on at the end of the year and we are seeking volunteers so that classes can continue next year.

Ethics teachers receive full training by Primary Ethics, the not-for-profit organisation approved to design curriculum and training for the ethics program. Training consists of a two day workshop and short online modules. Lesson materials are provided. Suitable volunteers have an interest in children's education and development of critical thinking skills and must be available at 9.25 am or 9.55am on Tuesday each week.

In ethics classes, children learn how to think logically, disagree respectfully and support their arguments with evidence, rather than act according to blind habit or peer pressure.

Children discuss topic such as: -imagining how others feel -how do we treat living things? -what is laziness? -how do we disagree in a respectful way? -fairness

*NOTE*_ANY change to a booking once it has been submitted will incur a \$5 fee per change, per child.






- · Children are introduced to science concepts and skills in a safe and supervised environment.

- The Junior Science Academy is for children in Years K-6 in primary school.






