Principal Report

From the Principal's desk.



Welcome back.

I hope you all enjoyed the school holidays. Term 3 has commenced with a number of COVID restrictions still in place and the expectation that they will remain for some time.

Resuming activities for term three include.

- All school sport and activities including competitions aligned with current health advice (including those activities run by external organisations)
- Inter-school student events and competitions (choirs, sport, debating, public speaking, performing arts, Selective Sports High School trials etc.)
- Incursions not already permitted involving external adult providers maintaining distancing and hygiene aligned with the health advice of the day (e.g. school banking talks, sport promotions etc. – not directly curriculum related)
- Parent/ teacher meetings
- Staff meetings can be held considering physical distancing and maximum numbers in a space according to current health guidelines, or use on-line technology
- Professional learning for school staff can recommence with preference for using on-line technology. Professional development at external venues can continue in line with the venue's requirements to abide by current guidelines. Professional development can occur on site as long as physical distancing is maintained.
- Work experience for students (with appropriate risk assessment)
- Practicum teaching for tertiary education students
- P&C meetings strong preference for on-line where possible

Activities under consideration from later in the year

- The following events will be reconsidered in Term 3. For now, these events must remain on hold.
- School camps
- Excursions (other than field trips explained above)
- Parent attendance at assemblies and other school events (e.g. graduation ceremonies or student speech events)
- Group photos for staff
- Parent volunteers e.g. parent reading helpers (note: canteen and uniform shop volunteers are permitted)
- Interstate excursions
- School-based activities that involve large gathering of adults are not permitted at this time. These
 include parent/community gatherings such as parent functions, working bees, fundraisers, school
 BBQs, large parent information evenings, and large on-site cultural events. These large gatherings
 and the following activities will continue to be reviewed and assessed based on AHPPC and NSW
 Health advice and may be permitted at a later date.

Community

Enrolments for Kindergarten 2021 are now being accepted. Also remind neighbours, friends and families that now is the time to commence the enrolment process.

Teaching and Learning

Reports have been distributed and many of you have attended the three-way learning conversations. Thank you for the care you have demonstrated in respecting our processes to allow these interviews to happen. The opportunity to discuss with your child and their teacher future learning goals is important. I have been pleased with the high engagement rate. The teachers have found the new process excellent and enjoyed their conversations.

This term inhouse and online professional learning will continue for teachers. Stage One Year One have begun their intensive focus on teaching reading and writing. They will meet for half a day once a fortnight.

The school is continuing to arrange excursions and external activities with tentative dates, I apologise for the ongoing cancellations. Stage 2 Gibberagong excursion has been postponed and will be re-scheduled for Term 4. The school is responding to advice as it is given and often operators, even those who can operate are making last minute changes and withdrawing services. The health and safety of the students is paramount.

Congratulations

Great results for year 6 with 25 first round offers of selective high school placements and a further 5 students on the reserve list. Well done students and a big thank you to teachers and parents for supporting their learning journey.

Congratulations to Ms Iona McFarland and Ms Nilly Paktan who have become permanent staff members at Denistone East. Both Nilly and Iona have been part of our long-term temporary team and it's great to welcome them to the permanent teaching team.

Building and Grounds

The grounds had a big tidy up during the holidays with trees being trimmed and a few removed. Thank you to Ryde City Council for the upgrades to our footpaths and the returfing of nature strips. The streetscape in Brabyn Street looks greatly improved and is much safer. Work will continue on our garden projects during the term.

Health and Hygiene

It is cold and flu season and we are all remaining vigilant in our prevention of the spread of all illnesses. Please continue to access COVID testing if you or any member of your family presents with symptoms or in is in contact with someone who tests COVID -19 positive.

Let the school office know if you are having your child tested for COVID-19. This will be managed confidentially and once your child has received the all clear they can return to school. If someone else in the household is being tested, please keep all school age children at home until the all clear is given.

Staff are following the same procedures. COVID -19 testing results take 24-72 hours to be returned. Please inform me immediately if anyone in family tests positive for COVID-19, again the results will be kept confidential but the school will need to put into place a number of processes and procedures. Ryde Hospital is our nearest testing site.

Additional cleaning of the school continues, with a cleaner on site all day. This allows toilets to be regularly cleaned and high traffic areas to be spot cleaned on an ongoing basis
