Building Update

A professional removal team will be provided to move furniture and teaching resources. Furniture and resources will be assessed and evaluated post move and additional and replacement resources will be ordered if required.

Learning.

There was a great response to our three way learning conversations and student goal setting on Monday evening. I hope that by having the meetings on one day it has made it easier for families to coordinated work and family commitments. If you were unable to make the evening please contact your child's teacher and arrange another mutually convenient time.

Maths Olympiad and Peer Support continue each Tuesday. Both these programs are having a significant impact on student learning and wellbeing. Our senior students are developing leadership skills and mentoring skills with the younger students. Book Week Character parade provided a wonderful opportunity for the senior students to support the Kindergarten children.

Sport in Schools is providing a gymnastic skills program that is developing strength, flexibility and balance as well as delivering a social skills program.

Our school leaders will participate in a workshop on the meaning of Welcome to Country and its significance later this term. The workshop will be conducted by Dave Lardner from the Aboriginal Learning and Wellbeing unit.

Staff News

Beginning Teachers continue their intensive professional learning, focussing on planning and programming, differentiating curriculum and assessment of learning. The meetings are held Wednesdays before school and hosted in different teacher's rooms to encourage sharing and dialogue based on real classroom experiences. The new classroom organisation will assist in continue to support and grow our new teachers by allowing strategic mentoring. We also welcome several interns to the school this term. These pre service teachers are on their final practicum and will be with us until week 9. The internship gives them the opportunity to plan and program units of work and teach whole days, their supervising teacher provides support and acts in a mentoring role to have them school ready for term 4 when they graduate.

The executive team are beginning the planning for 2020 of staff and classes. Stage teams are being formed and teacher availability is being assessed. We are also looking at our major professional learning goals to maximise student learning. We are hoping to introduce a targeted early literacy program in Kindergarten, Year 1 and 2 with the expert assistance of Janice Farmer- Hailey. Janice has taught and presented in New Zealand, United States, England and Canada. She continues to investigate teacher professional learning around pedagogy that supports sustained literacy growth for students as they move through the earlier years of schooling.

I have included a snippet from children's author Mem Fox that will assist our younger students develop. **10 read-aloud commandments**

1. Spend at least ten wildly happy minutes every single day reading aloud.
2. Read at least three stories a day: it may be the same story three times. Children need to hear a thousand stories before they can begin to learn to read.
3. Read aloud with animation. Listen to your own voice and don't be dull, or flat, or boring. Hang loose and be loud, have fun and laugh a lot.
4. Read with joy and enjoyment: real enjoyment for yourself and great joy for the listeners.
5. Read the stories that the kids love, over and over and over again, and always read in the same 'tune' for each book: i.e. with the same intonations on each page, each time.
6. Let children hear lots of language by talking to them constantly about the pictures, or anything else connected to the book; or sing any old song that you can remember; or say nursery rhymes in a bouncy way; or be noisy together doing clapping games.
7. Look for rhyme, rhythm or repetition in books for young children, and make sure the books are really short.
8. Play games with the things that you and the child can see on the page, such as letting kids finish rhymes, and finding the letters that start the child's name and yours, remembering that it's never work, it's always a fabulous game.
9. Never ever teach reading, or get tense around books.
10. Read aloud every day, mothers and fathers, because you love being with your child, not just because it's the right thing to do.

***Tell Them From Me* Student Feedback Survey Weeks 1 and 2 (Term 4 2019)**

We are delighted that early next term our school, like many other public schools in the state will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used *Tell Them From Me* to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours in the students' Library time in Term 4 between Monday 14 Oct and Friday 25 Oct. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

A consent form and FAQs for parents/carers about the survey is being sent home with students. If you **do not** want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school by **Friday 6 September**.

***Tell Them from Me* Semester 2 Parent Survey**

This Term our school will be participating in the *Partners in Learning* parent survey, another part of the *Tell Them From Me* suite of surveys (student, teacher and parent surveys) on student engagement. The survey asks parents and carers questions about different factors that are known to impact on student wellbeing and engagement.

Running this survey will help our school understand parents' and carers' perspectives on their child's experience at school. These include: communication between parents/carers and staff, activities and practices at home and parent/carer views on the school's support of learning and behaviour. This valuable feedback will help our school make practical improvements.

The survey is conducted entirely online on smartphones, iPads, tablets, laptops or computers. The survey will typically take 15 minutes or less to complete and is completely confidential. The parent survey will be conducted between 26 August and 25 October. Although participating in the survey is entirely voluntary your responses are very much appreciated.

This week's Traffic Message and Resource:

Using the Crossing

Please use the traffic lights on Lovell St and the pedestrian crossing (Zebra crossing) on Brabyn St to cross - show your kids the right thing to do.

P&C News

You and your child should always use a pedestrian crossing if there is one available. It is the safest point at which to cross a road. Share how to use the different pedestrian crossings with your child when you are out walking together. Model the correct behaviours - they learn from you.



Children's crossings

Children's crossings are usually part-time crossings that operate before and after school hours. They can also operate at other times when children use the crossing for excursions or during break times. When the red 'Children Crossing' flags are displayed, you must stop at the white line if pedestrians are waiting to cross. Drivers must remain stopped until the crossing is clear of pedestrians.

Pedestrian crossings (zebra crossings)


Talk with your child about waiting until all vehicles have stopped before starting to cross. Some drivers may not stop for pedestrians. If you are driving, you must slow down and stop when a pedestrian steps onto a marked crossing. You must give way to any pedestrian on the crossing. Crossings with poor visibility have zigzag white lines painted on the road to warn drivers.

If there is school crossing supervisor, hold hands with your child and wait together on the footpath, at least one step back from the edge of the road, until the supervisor indicates that it is safe to enter the crossing.

If you are driving, you must stop until the crossing supervisor's hand-held sign is no longer displayed, or until the supervisor indicates that you may proceed through the crossing.



Remember to model safe and considerate behavior for your child – they will learn from you!





