WELCOME back everyone! Awesome news!! Our school canteen has undergone a makeover during the holidays. It now boasts spanking brand new stainless steel bench tops, cabinets and shelves.





Doesn't it look fantastic?? The canteen is now in line with the Food Safety Standards. All these could not have happened without the help of Tammy. A massive thank you to her for coordinating and supervising the renovation. What a great job!!

The canteen opens 5 days a week at recess and lunchtime and is managed by Elaine, the canteen manager. The canteen partners with MunchMonitor to provide an online ordering system for hot/cold food, snacks and drinks for recess and lunch. Instructions on how to join Munch Monitor are provided in the table below.

Lunch orders can only be placed via online orders. Parents are not permitted at the canteen for orders or purchases. This is to ensure our school is compliant with Covidsafe requirements.

Lunch orders are available every day of week and are perfect for Kindy kids as they are delivered to the classrooms. All orders must be done through our online system MunchMonitor. **The cut-off time for placing online orders is 8:20am on the day. Any orders after 8.20am will not be accepted.** You may pre-order up to 4 weeks in advance.

- You can view what they have ordered from the online transaction reports

From the NSW Transport for NSW-Centre for Road Safety:

"Children are impulsive and have little or no sense of danger. Boys are twice as likely to be involved in child pedestrian casualties as girls. Boys aged 13 years have the highest rate of child pedestrian casualties. Remember children:

- Are small and fast
- Are impulsive, easily distracted and little or no sense of danger
- Find it hard to judge the direction of sounds, the speed and distance of oncoming vehicles and the gaps between them
- Are still learning to identify safe crossing places and anticipate driver behaviour

Make sure your driving and parking are not endangering your own or others' children. Obey all parking signs and speed limits, and always be on the lookout for the unexpected. Many traffic safety issues around schools arise from the poor driving and parking behaviour of parents."

Once you have created an account, and identified Denistone East Public School for your child the full catalogue of uniform items will be available to select your purchase and pay online.


Appointments


